## Why Does My Contract Number Look <u>Different?</u>

There's a new procurement instrument identification (PIID) numbering system that will standardize procurement transactions across the Federal Government. Beginning on <u>October 1, 2017</u> the contract number for new awards will follow the new procurement instrument identifier, or PIID format.

Here's what Contracting Officers need to know:

- If you use a contract writing system, there's no action required on your part. All changes described should occur automatically in agency contract writing systems.
- If you report your actions directly into FPDS, ensure you use the new numbering structure.

## Contract Numbering System Elements of a PIID

Sequential Number for Specific Type of Solicitation or Contract 0001,0002.....0095

Activity Address Code

(AAC) FAR 2.101 - A distinct six-position code consisting of a combination of alpha and/or numeric characters assigned to identify specific agency offices, units, activities, or organizations.

## **Instrument Code**

**Examples of Instrument Codes Primary Codes Include** 

A = BPA

**C** = All types of Contracts except IDIQs

D = IDIQ (including FSS, GWAC, etc.)

F = Task Orders, Delivery Orders or calls (under IDIQs)

L = Lease Agreements

P = Purchase Orders (could be 'V' if you run out of #s)

Q = RFQ (could be 'U' if you run out of #s

R = RFP
